FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

What are the benefits for a child attending ROAR Summer Camp? Our staff and camp counselors love Jesus and love kids. They are trained to provide a safe and fun environment where campers can learn more about: sports, the arts, science and most importantly a savior that loves them!

How are kids chosen for scholarships? Children receiving scholarships attend Richmond Drive Elementary located in Catawba Terrace and are chosen for eligibility by their teachers at RDES.

Does ROAR receive any profit from the donated scholarships? No. Here is how a **Camp Champion's** scholarship donation is spent:
Food = \$25
5 total meals
Camp t-shirt = \$5
Staff = \$40
includes extra staff, bus driver, gas and other operating expenses

What does a day at camp look like? The day starts at 8 am and ends at 1 pm and it is packed with all kinds of games, friendly competition, team fun and bible time.
